




























# Instructions for Assembly of Number Puzzle
















### Instructions for Use of the What Time Is It Practice Sheet


The following sheet can be used for clock reading practice in one of two ways:


- 1. You can draw in hands on the clocks and have your child write the time on the line.
- 2. You can write times on the lines and have your child draw in the clock hands.



























# Instructions for Assembly of Practice Clock


- 1. Print clock page and page with clock hands on card stock.
- 2. Laminate for durability.
- 3. Cut out clock hands.
- 4. Poke a hole in the center of the clock.
- 5. Poke holes through the gray dots on the clock hands.
- 6. Use a paper fastener to fasten the clock hands to the clock face.








### Instructions for Assembly of Angel Wing Mini-Books


There are 3 different types of mini-books on the following pages, one with 3/8 inch manuscript lines, one with wide ruled lines, and one without lines. You'll find that there are two printable pages for each type of book, one with the covers and mini-book pages, and one with just mini-book pages. Follow the directions below for preparing each type of book.


- 1. Print pages on printer paper.
- 2. Cut out front and back cover and mini-book pages.
- 3. Stack the covers and pages.
- 4. Staple on the vertical line found on the cover page.























### Angel Dice

### **Instructions for Assembly:**

- 1. Print page on card stock.
- 2. Cut out dice. Be careful to avoid cutting off the tabs.
- 3. Fold on solid lines to create a cube shape.
- 4. Fold and put glue on tabs.
- 5. Glue together into a cube shape inserting the tabs inside the die.





### Instructions for Use of the Game Boards and Pieces

On the following pages you'll find three angel game boards and their accompanying playing pieces. These game boards are intended for generic use. You can make up any rules you like to go with them. For example, you could have each player draw a flashcard and give the answer. If correct, he can roll a die or dice and move his piece forward. If incorrect, he must leave his piece where it is. This is just one of many possibilities for play.

Each game board has its own theme:

- With On Clouds of Love, each player is trying to get his angel up to heaven on clouds of love.
- In the Guardian Angel Adventure, two players are trying to get their guardian angels to their respective charges. Each angel has his own track on which to do that.
- With the Heaven's Gate board, each player is attempting to get his angel to the gate of Heaven.

You can also make up your own story or theme to go with each game board. These are just suggestions.


I hope your children have many hours of playing enjoyment with these game boards.

### Instructions for Assembly of the On Clouds of Love Game Board

There are two types of pieces that make up the game board: 1) one with the image and a white border on one side, and 2) one with just the image. Some sides of each piece have a solid blue line and others have just the edge of the image. Look carefully for these when cutting out the pieces so that you don't accidentally cut off the white section of the game board. When assembling the game board, the image portion of one piece will be glued on top of the white border of the other.

- 1. Print the pages of the board on printer paper.
- 2. Cut out the pieces.
- 3. Glue the left side of the board on the right.
- 4. When the glue is dry, laminate the game board.





## Instructions for Assembly of the Guardian Angel Adventure &

### Heaven's Gate Game Boards

As shown at right, there are three types of pieces that make up the game board: 1) one with the image and a white border on two sides, 2) one with the image and a white border on one side, and 3) one with just the image.

Note that some sides of each piece have a solid line and others have just the edge of the image. Look carefully for these when cutting out the pieces so that you don't accidentally cut off a section of the game board.

When assembling the game board, the image portion of one piece will be glued on top of the white border of another. All but one of the pieces are labeled with letters. Use these letters as a guide when assembling the game board as explained below.




Step 2: Cut out the pieces.


Step 3: Using the figure at right as a guide, assemble the individual pieces in the following order:


- 1. Glue piece B on A.
- 2. Glue the unlabeled piece on C.


Step 4: Assemble the previously glued sets of pieces by gluing the unlabeled piece & piece C on pieces A & B.


Step 5: When the glue is dry, laminate the game board for durability.

























### Instructions for Assembly of Playing Pieces

#### Parts of a Playing Piece:



Step 1: Print off the page on card stock.

Step 2: Cut out the playing pieces.

Step 3: Fold the playing piece on Line 1 so that the Figure sides are facing out as shown in Fig. 1.

Step 4: Flip the piece over and fold on Line 2 as show in Fig. 2.

Step 5: Complete Steps 3 and 4 on the other side of the piece. When you are done, it should look like Fig. 3.

Step 6: Put glue on the inside of both Base Tops and on one blank side of the Figure section. See Fig. 4.

Step 7: Bring all of the sections in so that the Base Tops are glued to the Base Bottom and the blank sides of the two Figures are also glued together. It should look like Fig. 5.

Step 8: Hold the playing piece for a minute or so until the glue holds or use paper clips to hold it together until it dries. When finished, it should look like Fig. 6.
